

PAMPERED PET TREAT JAR

Project Supplies You Will Need

For Dog Treat Jar

1 Ball® Wide Mouth
Quart Jar

1 Ball® Wide Mouth
Dome® Lid and Band

½ Pound Small
Flavored Dog Treats

2 Large Dog Biscuits

1 Large (Size 16)
Dog Collar, Any Color

1 Medium
Rawhide Bone

1 Sprig of Holly

For Kitty Treat Jar

1 Ball® Regular Pint Jar

1 Ball® Regular Dome®
Lid and Band

12-ounces Kitty Treats

1 (Size 8) Cat Collar with
Bell, Any Color

9-inch Garland of Holly

**Additional craft supplies
to have on hand:** Scissors,
hot glue gun and hot glue
stick.

Step 1, Getting Started: Read complete Pampered Pet Treat Jar Instructions before starting. Assemble all supplies.

Step 2, Assembling Pampered Pet Treat Jar Base: For the Dog Treat Jar, add enough small flavored dog treats to cover 1 inch of bottom of the wide mouth quart jar. Place large dog biscuits on end inside the jar. Fill remaining space with small treats. To make a Kitty Treat Jar, simply fill the pint jar with your pet's favorite kitty treat.

Step 3, Assembling Pampered Pet Treat Jar Lid: Adjust the wide mouth lid and band onto the Dog Treat Jar. Wrap the dog collar around the band and tighten until secure. Glue in place if necessary. Adjust the regular lid and band onto the Kitty Treat Jar. Wrap the cat collar around the band and tighten until secure.

Step 4, Finishing Touches: Arrange and hot glue the sprig of holly and rawhide bone to the side of the collar to finish off the Dog Treat Jar. Hot glue a garland of holly around the top edge of the band of your Kitty Treat Jar. Decorative items can also be tied on with a piece of raffia or leather cord instead of gluing. **Note:** Hot glue guns should only be used according to manufacturer's instructions. Please read all handling and safety instructions and be especially cautious when using around small children. Craft glue is a safe alternative.
