

PET BISCUIT JAR (DOG TREATS)

Project Supplies You Will Need

1 Ball® Wide Mouth Pint Jar
1 Ball Wide Mouth Lid & Band
Jar Funnel
Jar Tamper
Recipe Card
Cookie Cutter

Mix For Jar

1 1/2 Cups All-purpose Flour
1/2 Teaspoon Salt
1/2 Teaspoon Garlic Powder
1/2 Cup Cornmeal
1/2 Cup Nonfat Dry Milk
1/2 Cup Wheat Flour
1/4 Cup Brown Sugar, packed
2 Cubes Chicken or Beef
Bouillon, crushed

To Prepare Treats, Add

1/4 Cup Boiling Water
4 Tablespoons Butter or
Margarine
1 Egg, beaten

Step 1, Getting Started: Read all instructions for the Pet Biscuit Jar before starting. Assemble all supplies.

Step 2, Layering Dry Mix: Combine All-purpose Flour, Salt and Garlic Powder in a small bowl. Place mixture into the Jar and firmly pack using a Jar Tamper. Layer the remaining ingredients into the Jar in the order listed, packing each layer evenly and firmly. Adjust Lid and Band. Makes base for one recipe of Doggie Treats.

Step 3, To Prepare Dog Treats (*instructions to write on recipe card*): Preheat oven to 325 F. Remove the Crushed Bouillon from the Jar. Dissolve in 1/4 Cup Boiling Water, set aside. Place remaining ingredients from the Jar into a large mixing bowl. Stir to combine. Cut in the Butter or Margarine until a crumbly batter is formed. Add the Egg and Bouillon Broth. Mix until a stiff dough is formed. Turn out dough onto floured work surface. Knead dough several times until dough is elastic. Using a rolling pin, roll out dough into a 1/2-inch thick slab. Cut out dog bone shapes using a bone-shaped Cookie Cutter or a knife. Place cookies 1-inch apart on a greased cookie sheet. Bake for 50 minutes or until lightly browned.

Step 4, Finishing Touches: Place a fabric round on top of the lid and hold in place with band. Adorn Jar with dog collar and bone-shaped cookie cutter or a squeak toy. Attach recipe card with the "To Prepare" instructions on the Jar using raffia or ribbon.
